Please note that not all of the awards listed may be offered each year. There may also be additional awards offered. The Awards Selection Committee will consider you for any and/or all awards offered.

- **Blue Earth Area High School LGBT School Award** for up to two outstanding LGBT graduating seniors from Blue Earth Area High School.
- **Carey/Taylor Scholarship Award** for a gay, lesbian, bisexual or transgender student pursuing a degree in instrumental music performance. This scholarship is designed for a LGBT student at a Minnesota university, college or music academy. Preference will be given to a male student in graduate school.
- **Gilligan Pospisil Scholarship** for a gay, lesbian, bisexual or transgender student who has experienced homelessness or is working to alleviate homelessness, or a student in the field of social and economic justice.
- **Haynes/Hettinga Award** for a deserving African-American or Native American student.
- **The Holland-Federhart Award** for an openly LGBT or allied outstanding student, with a preference for a student in the performing arts or, secondly, in the arts.
- **Howard Liebhaber Human Rights Award** in support of a student who demonstrates a commitment to alleviate oppression, works for social change and demonstrates financial need.
- **Dr. Tom Knabel Award** for a high school student who has demonstrated outstanding academic achievement with a preference for a student with recognized achievement in choral singing or musical instrument performance.
- **Linde-Ostrander Leadership Award** in support of one person who is the most qualified LGBTQ person attending college, vocational, graduate, law or medical school who demonstrates leadership in bridging differences and breaking down barriers between the LGBTQ and straight communities. Applicants must have completed one year of post-secondary education.
- **The Manahan Bohan Award** for an outstanding lesbian student from the Madelia, Minnesota area or secondarily, an exceptional lesbian student from rural Minnesota.
- **Mankato State University Award** for an outstanding gay, lesbian, bisexual or transgender student attending Mankato State University.
- **Meuwissen-Werb Award** for an out, gay, lesbian, bisexual, transgender or intersex student with demonstrated leadership abilities in fostering integration and mutual respect between LGBTI and straight communities. Preference is given to a student with excellent academic achievements pursuing a 4-year degree.
- **Miriam Weinstein Peace and Justice Education Award** for a student from a religious, racial or ethnic minority who has shown a commitment to peace and social justice issues. Preference given to someone majoring in education who has completed two years of college.
- **The PF Award** for engineering and applied science for an undergraduate or graduate student in the fields of engineering, physics or chemistry who has financial need.
- **Quorum Scholarship** for a student leader with entrepreneurial spirit who works for equality.
- **Southeast Minnesota Award** in support of an LGBT student from or studying in Southeast Minnesota.
- **Wellness Award** in support of a LGBT student with an interest in studying chemical dependency counseling or an LGBT student who is in recovery.

2. Please describe your educational and career goals.
3. PFund scholarships promote education to strengthen leadership in and for the LGBT communities. Explain how this goal will be promoted if you receive a scholarship. Please talk about what you aspire to and what your passions are.
4. GPA is not a primary determinant in making awards, but may be considered as one of many factors. If you feel your transcript does not effectively represent your abilities, please explain.

- Answers to essay questions** (applicants with disabilities are encouraged to inquire regarding alternative formats)
- Letters of recommendation.** All students must submit two letters of recommendation. Graduate students, current and incoming students must submit one academic and one work/volunteer related letter. For high school students only, one of the letters may be from a friend or family member.
- Official, sealed transcript** of most recent educational enrollment
 - Current high school student: high school transcript
 - GED graduate: GED certificate
 - Trade school, college, university, or graduate student: most recent institution attended
 - All others: most recent high school, post-secondary or training program attended
